CITY OF NEWNAN AND LEAVES, YARD DEBRIS

The City of Newnan would like to remind everyone that it is important not to leave your leaves and grass clippings in a pile anywhere near the storm drains. By piling or bagging your leaves and grass clippings you can help prevent clogging our storm drains, prevent flooding, prevent harming the aquatic and biological life and keep our streets and sidewalks clean.

A contractor is responsible for their work and must remove the debris themselves. ***When contractors cut, trim and rake leaves, this yard debris becomes theirs and cannot be put out on curb for pickup. This debris needs to be hauled away by the contractor.***

In regards to pruning, tree and brush removal, and planting to be careful when working near a creek. Only hand cut small underbrush and minimize tree pruning. Trees and bushes help moderate the temperature of the water; filter pesticides, nitrogen, phosphorus, and sediment; and help prevent bank erosion. State and local ordinances prohibit clearing of buffers without a permit.
